





All of the fish on this list are commonly caught with a fly rod by our customers at FlyMasters.

All of these fish can be caught in Indiana with a Fly Rod!



2. Where can you fly fish in Indiana? The answer is:

Anywhere you find water!



When people come into the store and ask for a place to fish I grab a DeLorme of Indiana and start showing them all the streams available for fishing. People also have the impression that our streams are polluted, dirty, nasty etc. and are unfit for sporting purposes. We do have a few streams in the state that might be described as thus. However, I have not fished on such a steam in the last 20 years. And I have fished all over the state. We rarely keep what we catch in streams since we fish for sport. And the different sport fish are so much fun on a fly rod that we would like the chance to catch them again. But many of our customers love to eat bluegill, crappie, catfish that are caught in many

ponds and lakes in Indiana. As I write this note the lake I live on is already frozen and I anticipate some ice fishing this winter. Nothing better to fry up than some slab bluegill caught through the ice in the middle of winter!



Beginning Fly Fishing School We have folks come into the shop all the time asking "where do you fly fish in Indiana?". Believe it or not you can catch many different species of fish within 1 to 3 hours of Indianapolis. Smallmouth Bass, Largemouth Bass, White Bass, Hybrid Bass, Striped Bass, Steelhead, Salmon, Trout (Browns and Rainbows), Muskie, Northern Pike, Carp, and sunfish can all be caught on a fly rod! With just a little instruction you can begin to enjoy fly fishing for any of these species in no time at all. Our fly fishing school is a cut above the rest because we work around your busy schedule and make it convenient for you to learn.

Our school offers an introduction to fly fishing, basic equipment, casting techniques, playing

and landing fish. The school is divided into three convenient phases to allow you to gain the most out of each session.

Phase One: Introduction to Equipment and Knots (in store phase we

schedule)

Phase Two: Basic fly casting and still water fly fishing (by appointment

Monday through Saturday Morning)

Phase Three: Moving water and stream techniques (by appointment Monday

through Saturday Morning)

We start our school when there is still snow on the ground. Phase one of our school is in the shop so we can start people on their way to learning how to fly fish early in the season. Phases two and three are usually on an individual basis, arranged around your schedule. Sessions will very in length from one to three hours. It is best to have your own equipment,







Beginning Fly Tying The beginning fly tying class is designed for absolute beginners. If you have never tied a fly before this is your class. We will take you through all the steps of setting up our vise and tools to tying 8 different flies. This is a four part class that meets once a week for two hours. There is a class that is held during the week on **Tuesday nights from 7:00 — 9:00pm**. The other class is held on **Saturday mornings from 10:00am —12:00am**. They are the same class in the series just on different days to provide greater flexibility. There is formal instruction on tools, hooks, materials, thread as well


as how to tie flies. The cost of the class is **\$50.00**. This include all instructions, all tools and all materials. All you need to bring each class is yourself and a desire to tie flies!

This class is open to children seven years or older and adults of all age. We encourage parents and children as well as husband and wives to take this class together. Fly tying is a great activity for everyone and a wonderful way to spend an afternoon (especially a snowy one).

Intermediate and Skills Development Fly Tying

The goal of this class is to provide instruction concerning various tying skills, use of tools and materials, and fly patterns. This class meets for three hours on **Saturdays from 2:00pm** — **5:00pm** (usually). Many tiers want to learn new and interesting fly patterns. Some are more interested in other techniques and skills in fly tying. The flies we tie are usually focused on upcoming fishing seasons as well as flies requested by tiers. We will also

throughout the year be focusing on new tying techniques. Whether learning to spin deer hair, learning about various dubbing techniques or learning to work with certain materials, we will have special classes that are focused on advancing your tying skills. The cost of this class is normally \$15.00 and all materials are provided. Students do need to bring their own equipment and can check out our web site for each of the classes to see if any special tools or equipment is required for the class. Usually, we will have the flies posted a week ahead of the class on our web site so you can see what we will be tying.




The Bighorn River boasts trout populations as high as 7,500 fish per mile, with the numbers being the highest the closer you are to the dam. Trout in the river average around 15 inches, with many fish pushing the 20-inch range and beyond. Bighorn river trout fight as hard as any trout on the planet, due to the highly consistent water temperatures and abundant food available year round.

The combination of Bighorn Yellowtail Dam Lake and perfect creates the river environ for both trout and anglers alike, 365 days of the vear. Other than the clear, cold flows that come from this bottom-release dam, it's greatest effect is the fertile conditions that it creates in the river below. Throughout the river's length, Rainbow and Brown trout thrive on a steady diet of Crustaceans,



Midges, Mayflies, Caddis and Stoneflies. This abundance of food found in the Bighorn, creates terrific year round angling opportunity.

The greatest attribute of the Bighorn River is that it can be anything to anyone. By that I mean that the Bighorn River provides excellent angling opportunity for both beginners and experts alike. While many longtime Bighorn anglers prefer the abundant match the hatch dry fly fishing opportunity, nymph fishing is the most common practice on the Bighorn River. While nymph fishing from a drift boat is very productive, often it is most



rewarding as a wading angler. Concentrated populations of fish exist in the Bighorn's riffles, runs and drop offs where large trout key in on crustaceans and emerging insects. These highly productive river features along with consistent river conditions allow anglers of all skill levels the opportunity to consistently catch the rivers trout with nymphs 365 days a year.

While anglers can have success every day of the year fishing nymphs, the opportunity to catch trout on the surface is what draws anglers to the



Bighorn from March through November. Midges, Mayflies such as BWO's, PMD's, and Tricos, Yellow Sallies and Terrestrial insects create one of the longest dry fly seasons you will find anywhere.

Below Afterbay Dam the fishing stays productive for about 35 river miles. The Bighorn is broken up into

four distinct sections: Afterbay to 3 Mile, 3 Mile to Bighorn Access, Bighorn Access to Mallard's landing and Mallard's Landing to Two Leggins. Each section contains variances in water temperature, fish per mile, aquatic life,

hatches, and fish behavior. These characteristics create unique fishing conditions in which the fly fisher can have a wide array of terrific fishing throughout the year.

Anglers visiting the Bighorn River will find all the needed services and amenities to have a successful fishing trip in the town of Fort Smith, Montana. Fly shops, lodging, guide services; drift boat rentals, gas and groceries can be found here. Prime dates fill up quickly and anglers looking to visit the river should plan ahead. April/May and July/August tend to be the most popular months because of the variety of fishing had at that time. Excellent angling opportunity can be had from March through November.

As anglers, we all spend time on the water. Sometimes the fishing is fast, and

rig, or operate our boat, or even the tactics we employ as anglers.


We at TrueFlies started our clothing line this way, and continue to develop new products, as well as refine our existing products as we use them in the field.

Twill weave is most commonly found in high end men's dress shirts. Upon close inspection you can see fine diagonal parallel ribs. This parallel angle gives the fabric a soft hand feel. We took it a step further by doing it in a three-color tattersall plaid resulting in a soft, lightweight performance fishing shirt that your wife would be happy to see you wearing across from her at a table for two.

I have guided one of the Midwest's premier rivers for the last three years. In that time, I have taken close to 600 people down the Kankakee River. Almost every angler that has floated with me has said, "Wow! I never knew that



this river was so beautiful and how good the fishing is here". The Kankakee River is a hidden gem in a major metropolitan area. While on an 11 mile float, you will pass by natural limestone bluffs, have the opportunity to see some amazing bird life and have the river to yourself.

A common asked question I get is, "Is the Kankakee comparable to the Menominee River?" This is a popular question because on the Menominee a 20 inch smallmouth is common and it's even better when it happens on top water flies. The answer to this question is NO; but it's darn good and it's a whole lot closer.

The Kankakee goes through drastic changes throughout the season and the anglers' approach of how to fish the river needs to change as well. The fly angler has the option to fish both ends of the spectrum. You can either fish

chocolate milk colored water with a higher flow rate for bigger fish by stripping streamers early in the season. Or you can sight fish the river with crystal clear water due to tremendous weed growth, which acts as a natural filter for more numbers of fish with the occasional



big monster in the mix later in the summer.

In the years working the river, I've seen the need for your fly selection to change with the seasons. In early spring, into the beginning of summer, the fish seem to be more bottom and structure focused due to the higher flows. So from March to June, big crayfish and brightly colored baitfish will get it done for you. As the



heat of summer kicks in, start toning down the color choices of your streamers and start thinking about top water. I have had some of my best days on the river with fish crushing top water in 90 degree sweltering heat, blue bird skies at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.



The water quality of the river is in great shape. The amazing hatches that happen on a daily basis is proof of that, so wet wading in the summer is a great option. Arm yourself with your favorite 6 or 7 weight, floating line and be ready for a good peaceful day by yourself and the fish.

If you would like to see the river the way I see it every day myself, my staff of guides or I would be happy to take you down one of Illinois premier smallmouth rivers. Grab Your Fly Charters is Chicago's only full time, four season guide service. Come, unplug and enjoy the solitude of the Kankakee River with three million people close by.



Flappin CrawZ are a big profile bait with big claws that rise up and get noticed. The claws are built to move easily with little effort so they are really good behind a ChatterBait, or a swim jig. Because of the large claws

and buoyancy of the bait, the Flappin CrawZ are the perfect trailer for big mop jigs and football jigs. They really help fill out the internal profile of the jig and will float the heaviest jig up so the claws get seen.

The Turbo CrawZ are the newest addition to the Z-Man family of craw style baits. In addition to being the newest, they're probably also the most

versatile. Initially, the Turbo CrawZ were created as a swim jig and ChatterBait trailer, it creates turbulence and action like a twin tail grub would. The Z-Man Turbo Craw is more versatile than any other craw on the market.



As a swim jig trailer, the Turbo CrawZ explodes with movement as a trailer. I

had rarely fished with swim jigs prior to developing the Turbo CrawZ. My first experience yielded a 20" Largemouth Bass which was followed up by an 18" Smallmouth. Now I believe swim jigs have substantial merit. I find myself wanting to fish the swim jig/turbo crawz combination all the



time. The action is intoxicating. The texture, specially cut claws and softness of the turbo crawZ requires minimal effort for maximum movement. Twin tailed grubs look like slow motion when compared to the turbo. The large body size does a great job of filling in the profile inside the skirt, giving the jig a much more carnivorous appearance. The same holds true when added to a ChatterBait. Between the vibration of the blade and the action of the Turbo CrawZ, you're going to get somebody's attention. Personally, after the

experience I've had with this rig, ChatterBaits and swim jigs simply look naked and incomplete without the Turbo CrawZ on the back.



There are times where I don't want the big profile of a swim jig or the noise of the ChatterBait, but still want to go after that reaction bite. I found a perfect compromise that allows me to cover water like I would with a swim jig or by swimming a

grub, but with a more slender profile and lots of action. By rigging the Turbo CrawZ on a $3/0\ 1/8$ oz. weighted EWG style hook, I'm able to keep it

crawl it back at this point.



The buoyancy that allows this bait to float up like that and remain keeled on the retrieve also allows me to fish it as a surface bait. Rigging it on an unweighted 4/0 EWG helps it act like a small buzz bait on the surface. Since it's weedless, I can run it through timber and the pads without it hanging up. It proved to be a very effective presentation over the shallow grass in one of the areas I fish frequently. Since it floats so well, I can pause the retrieve in open water allowing to be seen without fear of it sinking into the grass or the pads. It's more of a finesse topwater technique, but extremely effective when the fish aren't responding to larger topwater baits.

Having only had one short season to play with this new bait, I'm sure I will find more ways to use it and more ways to rig it. I'm also sure that after this piece is published, there will be some very imaginative anglers



who will find an application and rigging technique for the Turbo CrawZ that I wouldn't have thought of either. I just hope they're willing to share. Knowing anglers the way I do though, I have a feeling the best kept secrets will remain just that.

There are many different brands of tippet material on the market today, but there is one that differentiates itself, that would be Frog Hair. The uniqueness comes from the exclusive process that increases the flexibility (suppleness) and Shock Resistance, while achieving an incredibly high break and knot strengths. The process breaks down the long chains formed during the extrusion and drawing process, and creates millions of inter-molecular bonds within those

chains. It creates a material that is strong, abrasion resistant yet has the flexibility (suppleness) and impact strength (shock resistance) anglers look for.

Hair has three Frog different types of tippet material. Frog Hair High Performance **Tippet** material is copolymer based (nylon) material. Frog Hair FC is ultra-high molecularly weighted Polyvinylidene Fluoride (PVDF) material. Frog Hair Deep Blue is a high performance copolymer (nylon) base material for saltwater in use environments.

Frog Hair and Deep Blue tippet material are nylon based. They share relatively the same specific


gravity and refractive index. The difference is Deep Blue is designed to meet IGFA Class breaking strength requirements and have high "shock resistance" engineered into the material.



Tippet material should be viewed as a tool. Like the flies we use, each one has unique qualities that lend themselves to the task at hand. Copolymer and Fluorocarbon feel and fish differently. Here is a look at how density (specific gravity), and refractive index can affect your tippet.

The Density of a material is the weight of a material per unit of volume. Density is often expressed in terms of Specific Gravity, which is the density of a material relative to the density of water. Frog Hair Tippet material is 1.14 and most nylon based material is between 1.02-1.19. In comparison, Fluorocarbons have a specific gravity around 1.80. This means that Fluorocarbon will sink faster than copolymer material. The density of Fluorocarbon makes it more sensitive than a copolymer.

Refractive Index Summary



The Refractive Index is a measure of how fast light will travel through one material relative to another, water. 1.33 for Refractive Index of Frog Hair is 1.55. The typical range of for most nylon lines is between 1.52 - 1.58. Frog Hair FC Fluorocarbon tippet material is 1.42. This makes fluorocarbon less visible in the water than nylon.


Scenario 1 : Dry-fly – Copolymer works best. Sinks much slower than fluorocarbon. Fluorocarbon can actually kill the presentation and in some cases drag the fly under water.

Scenario 2: Nymphing – Standard nymph presentations can be

achieved with nylon and fluorocarbon. Fluorocarbon can be a better choice because it allows the nymph a more natural presentation. Secondary positives can be less visible and more sensitive.

Scenario 3: Right angle nymphing - use both, copolymer to the indicator and a fluorocarbon tippet. This allows the line to float to the indicator then sink, allowing a more natural presentation.

Copolymers are most versatile of the tippet material and can be used in all situations. Fluorocarbons are best used during sub-surface and bottom applications when sensitivity and less visible lines are desired.




A true innovation to fly tying has been created by Derrick Filkins at FlyMasters of HPU Indianapolis. The weedless fly enables the angler to cast into into cover without the fear of losing their fly. Conventional anglers have long had a weedless soft plastic and now the fly angler



has the HPU Weedless Fly. Here are the steps to tie one of the HPU patterns.

1. Take a long piece of Mason 50lb. hard mono and stretch it out to relieve the memory. Cut a short piece of 1 1/2" and place the piece in your vise. Make a thread base of your desired color and and brush on some Wapsi Fly Tyers Z-ment. This is very important! When you remove the fly to tie it to the hook you will cut the portion of the mono that was in the jaws of the vise. If you nick the thread the fly will not unravel if you have Z-mented the thread.



3. In our local streams I like Fl. Yellow or Fl. Chartreuse crystal chenille combined with the olive tail. Tie this in and wrap

forward. You can add hackle if want your fly to drop slower.

4. Stop your Crystal Chenille about 1/4" from the end of the mono and make a couple of wraps and/or a half hitch. After you tie a couple of these for a certain hook you will have a better idea of the length



take a pair of nippers and clip off the part that was sticking in the vise. If you Zmented the thread you will not have to worry about nicking the thread. Easier to be precise with a pair of Abel Nippers!

5. Remove the mono from the vise and

6. After cutting off the mono that was pliers and flattened the mono that you are going to tie to the hook. Orient the fly so the flattened portion is perpendicular to the side of your fly if that is important. If you ran some flash down the side of the body and/or tail you might prefer the flash

to be on the side of the fly after it is tied



7. The hook used on this fly is a Mustad 37162 size 2/0. It is a gold plated hook which provides some added flash to the fly. It has a short platform for which to tie the mono on. So if you cover a portion of the hook eye that is alright.



Just make sure you leave enough room in the hook eye to allow tippet to pass

on the hook.



through. Make a dozen wraps of thread and check the back of the fly to make sure that it does not touch any portion of the hook point.

You want the tail of marabou to pass freely up and down without hanging up on the hook point. The fly should be parallel on a

line passing from the hook point to the hook eye.


8. After you have determined that the fly does not bind on the hook point apply Z-ment to



the 12 or so wraps to help adhere the mono to the hook. Over the top of the Z-ment continue with more wraps and build a head for your fly. REMEMBER that several wraps of a thin thread will hold much better than a few wraps of a heavier thread. Heavier thread tends to leave gaps which eventually allow the fly thread to loosen up. Do not use thread that is more that 140 Denier. The fly is now done. Woolly Buggers are not the only thing you can tie HPU, see what else you come up with and send us picture at FlyMasters of Indianapolis. Cast this fly into some cover this summer and pull out a nice smallie!

Muskellunge and **Northern Pike** are also prime targets in Indiana. Eagle Creek Reservoir, the Tippecanoe River and Green Sullivan are great places for Musky. Northerns can be found in the upper Tippecanoe River, the Yellow River, and many reservoirs across the state.

The **Hybrid Bass** (a.k.a Wiper) is a cross between a Striped Bass and a White Bass and they have been stocked in a number of reservoirs across the state. Lake Monroe is the most popular around central Indiana.



Chinook (King) Salmon are a popular fall target in the tributaries of Lake Michigan. The St. Josephs River, The Dowagiac, The Little Calumet and Trail Creek are all places to target Kings from September through October. The tributaries in Michigan are also popular destinations and not too far away.



Carp are a growing target species all across the country and Indiana is no exception. A difficult fish to catch on a fly rod, the common Carp is found all across the state in ponds, lakes and streams. Especially, the shores of Lake Michigan where they grow very big.





Steelhead are another big game fish that folks in Indiana can target. There are two different strains stocked in Lake Michigan which means

there is almost year round steelhead fishing. All the tributaries that the salmon run in, mentioned above, are also great for steelhead. You can also head to Michigan and fish the rivers that flow into Lake Michigan and head to Ohio to fish a number of rivers that flow into Lake Erie for Steelhead. These fisheries are both within a six hour drive and are some of the most beautiful waters you can fish anywhere in the Midwest.












Brown Trout and Rainbow Trout can be found in select places through out the state. Trout are stocked in many locations but do not hold over due to poor stream conditions or waters getting too warm. But there are a few places that do have sustained populations of browns and rainbows. tailwaters of the Brookville Reservoir are a prime spot for catching these trout. Plus, you have a shot at some 20 inch plus fish. The Little Elkhart River in Northeast Indiana also has Kark a nice population of trout. Lastly, Brown Trout and Rainbow Trout will run into the tributaries of Lake Michigan in the fall and winter. So, the same streams you look for salmon & steelhead can hold some bonus trout.



These are the most common fish we target here in Indiana. This list is not all-encompassing. There are many more species across the Midwest that are targets for the fly rodder. Now take a look at the chart on the next page to find out When we fish for these species.





